With his striking black and white markings, Dodger can easily catch anyone's eye. This mid-size, middle-aged, terrier

mix is delighted to join anyone for a walk, followed by an easy plop on to the ground soon thereafter where he can be showered with affection and have his belly rubbed. His jerky walk and bobbing head are the symptoms of a neurological problem that he has had since he arrived at about 7 months old. That impediment does not slow Dodger down a bit, but it gives visitors pause and as a result, Dodger has spent nearly all of his life in a kennel, though he is beloved by many of the volunteers.



Dodger reacts with bluster to many of the other dogs when they walk by him, but pays little attention to any of them when walking on leash or during a one-on-one with any human. Although he does seem to like to walk, Dodger is more enthusiastic about just hanging out which bodes well for people who eschew a lot of dog walking responsibility. Dodger is very easy to direct with a treat under his nose, but his motor control and excitement for treats sometimes accidentally traps the fingers that are offering it, so palm-up treat service is highly recommended. This beautiful boy would be an exceptionally loving companion to anybody who enjoys the singular devotion of a dog.
